AutoZone Park is home to the AAA Memphis Redbirds and USL Championship 901 FC Soccer.



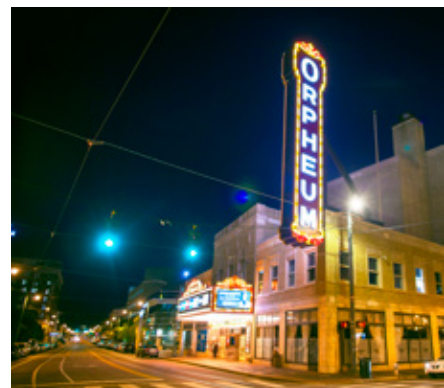
The Overton Park Shell hosts a variety of free music concerts.

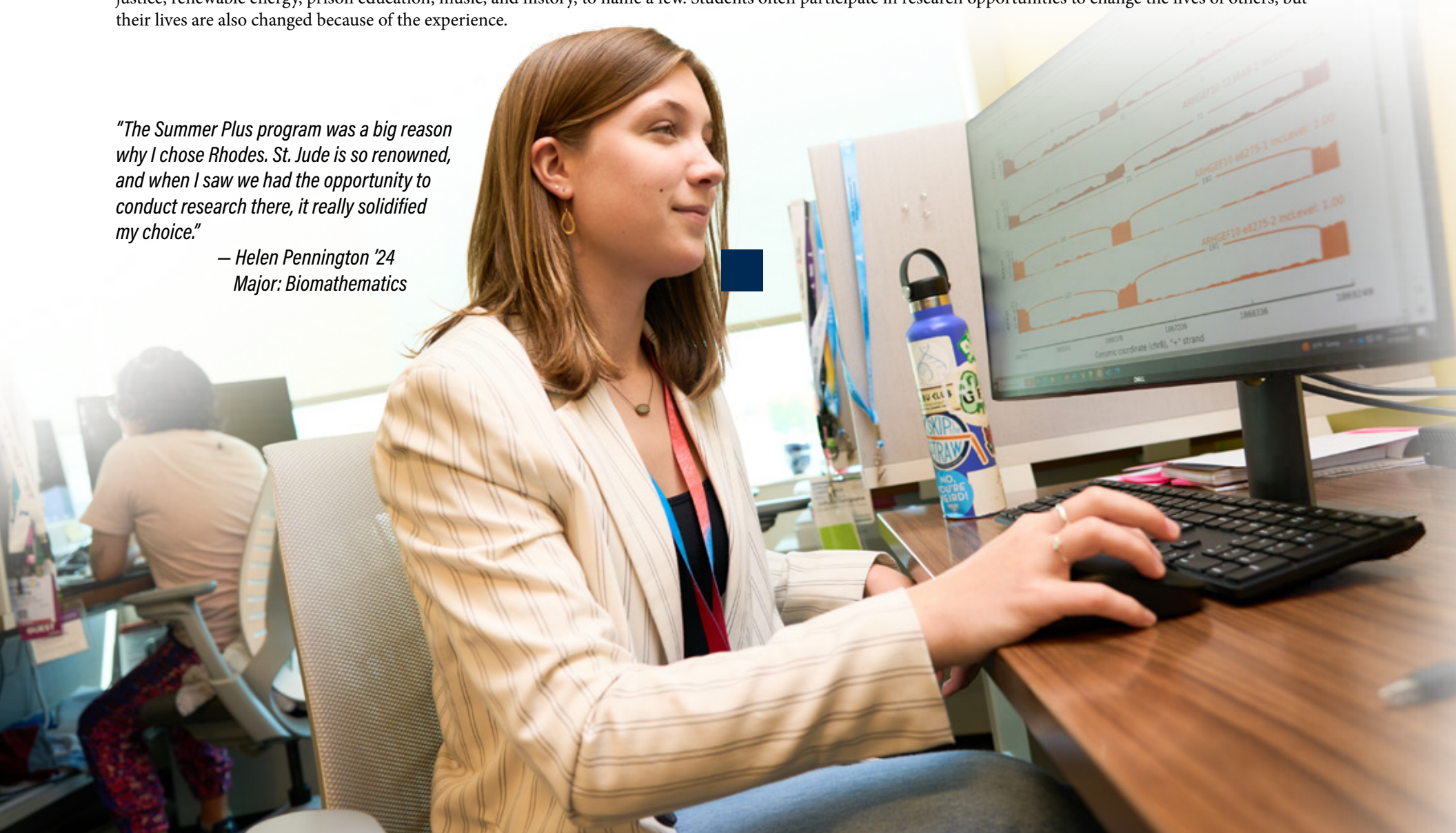


# A PLACE OF LIFE-CHANGING RESEARCH

As an undergraduate student, you'll have the opportunity to work alongside faculty on research projects. Some of those experiences will take place in labs on our beautiful campus, but many will occur in the Memphis community through partnerships with such organizations as St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, the Memphis Zoo, and the Memphis Museum of Science and History. Or, you might work with faculty research teams focused on the sciences, health equity, social justice, renewable energy, prison education, music, and history, to name a few. 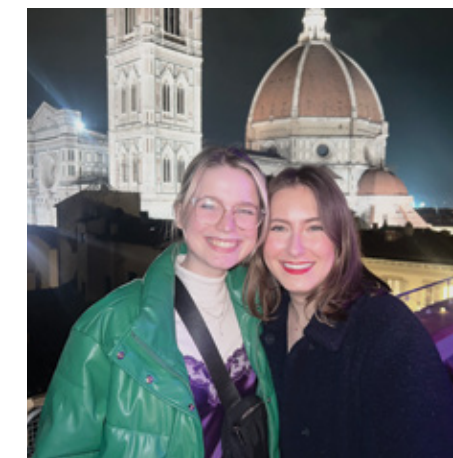

Rhodes' championship culture isn't just about winning titles—though we do plenty of that. It's also about supporting the entire student experience. Rhodes student-athletes enjoy a focus on balance—balancing athletics, academics, and community, which means our student-athletes achieve even more.

More than 30% of Rhodes students participate on one of our 23 men's and women's Division III athletic teams. Rhodes not only competes for Southern Athletic Association (SAA) championships on a regular basis, but also consistently ranks at the top of our conference academically. In 2022-23, Rhodes had 391 student-athletes named to the SAA Academic Honor Roll for achieving a 3.25 or higher semester GPA.

Our numbers speak for themselves. One year after earning their Rhodes degree, 97% of our graduates are employed, attend graduate school, or volunteer full-time. 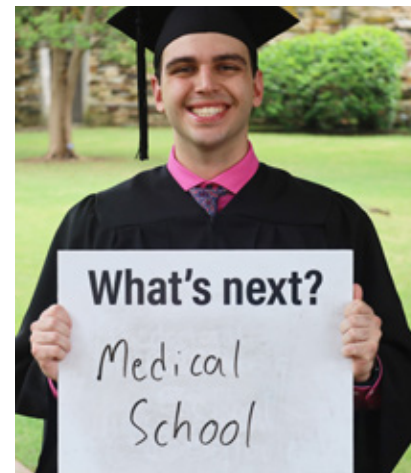

## ADMISSION AND SCHOLARSHIP DEADLINES

For the past 175 years, we've understood the value of the Rhodes experience—which is why we offer financial aid and scholarship programs that make it possible for qualified students from all walks of life to attend. With our merit-based and need-based financial aid packages, it is not uncommon for the actual out-of-pocket expense of attending Rhodes to be no greater than that of attending a large state university.

### Admission Deadlines

Rhodes practices holistic admission, meaning that our evaluation reviews each student's high school record, test scores (if submitted), written essay, extracurricular activities, and school and teacher recommendations.

### Common Application

The Common Application also serves as the application for Rhodes' merit-based competitive scholarships.

Early Decision II*	January 15 <i>(rolling notification begins Nov. 29)</i>

\*Early Decision (ED) applicants make a commitment to Rhodes as their first-choice institution and agree that, if admitted, they will enroll and withdraw all other applications assuming an adequate financial aid package is provided. Rhodes begins review of ED I applications on Sept. 1 and ED II applications on Nov. 15. Notifications of ED admission decisions are normally sent out twice a month.

\*\*Early Action (EA) applicants receive notification of their admission decision and eligibility for financial aid/scholarships by January 15. No binding commitment to attend Rhodes is required for EA consideration.

### Rhodes Merit Scholarships

Merit awards serve to recognize individual students for their academic talent, service, or leadership achievements. These competitive awards are determined on an individual basis and celebrate the strength and achievements of each admitted student, in and out of the classroom.

### Rhodes has a priority deadline of December 1 for the following merit-based scholarships.

Regardless of application plan (Early Decision I, Early Decision II, Early Action, Regular Decision), applications received by the Office of Admission on or prior to December 1 will be considered for the following merit awards.\*

\*For this application cycle, applications received after December 1 may still be considered for other merit awards as well as a limited number of the scholarships listed below.
