Tips For Consumers

For assistance in finding a qualified professional:

- Contact the Disability Services Director to discuss documentation requirements and your future plans.
- If additional documentation is required, seek assistance in identifying a qualified professional.

In selecting a qualified professional:

- Ask about the evaluator's credentials.
- Ask what experience he/she has had working with adults with learning disorders or ADHD.

In working with the professional:

- Take a copy of Rhodes' documentation guidelines to the professional.
- Encourage the evaluator to clarify questions regarding the documentation guidelines with the Disability Services Director.
- Be prepared to be forthcoming, thorough and honest with requested information.
- Know that professionals must maintain confidentiality with respect to your records and testing information.

As a follow-up to the assessment by the professional:

- Request a written copy of the assessment report.
- Request the opportunity to discuss the results and recommendations.
- Request additional resources if you need them.
- Maintain a personal file of your records and reports.
