

Student Counseling Center RSAP. Day to day work., fall semester, 2006

Research and expand counseling center lending library for students on mental health issues. Research and update training manual and support materials for Peer Advocacy program for Women's Center Peer Advocates. Co-teach Study Skills Workshops for first-year students and students at risk of failing. Research mental health issues ranging from eating disorders to spousal abuse for continuing education of graduate counseling interns. Survey peer institutions regarding counseling center training and staffing levels. Coordinate Safe Zones programming in support of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgendered, intersexed and questioning students. Co-lead Safe Zone trainings for faculty, staff and students. Research best practices for sexual assault and harassment policies and submit recommendations for changes to Rhodes policy.

Position Requirements: Creativity, strong interpersonal and communication skills, strong research and writing skills. Fluency in Microsoft word, interest in mental health issues, and understanding and respect for client confidentiality. (Although the Associate does not provide counseling services to Rhodes students, their work in the Counseling Center may occasionally bring them into contact with students coming to and from counseling sessions.) Ability to work independently.
