The ideal candidate for the Philosophy Department's Rhodes Student Associate will have some background in Philosophy (at least one course at the college level), especially in Logic (PHIL 206) given the need to serve as a tutor. In addition, the student should be attentive to detail, creative, resourceful, and capable of independent work.

The Philosophy Student Associate will have some of the following responsibilities:

- serving as a tutor for Logic (usually one section each semester) and, when appropriate, Introductory Seminar in Philosophy (PHIL 101),
- coordinating the Philosophy Film Series and/or Pub Talks,
- advertising and coordinating applications for various national student conferences,
- updating the departmental website,
- maintaining departmental bulletin board,
- compiling information on graduate programs in Philosophy.

The student associate will also function as a departmental research assistant whose responsibilities include:

- compiling a list of philosophy conferences with their submission deadlines,
- gathering philosophy articles and books,
- reading and providing summaries of articles.
