"Star Wars and the Monomyth." Professor Joe Jansen, Greek & Roman Studies

This lecture will explore the influence of Joseph Campbell's conception of the monomyth on the three original *Star Wars* films and the latest installment in the series, *The Force Awakens*. While the latter conforms to many of the stages of the hero cycle, the film breaks from the mold of the monomyth in some very important ways, as it tries to tell the story of a heroine compatible with the sentiments and values of the 21st century. The source of inspiration for this reimagining of the heroic quest can be found in Medieval Romance and modern novels, such as Lewis Carol's *Alice in Wonderland*.

I can't eat that, I'm on a diet! I hate the way I look! Does this make me look fat? Have you ever said or felt anything like this? If so, you're not alone. Seventy percent of 18-30 year old women don't like their bodies and over one-half of teenage girls and one-third of teenage boys use unhealthy behaviors to control their weight. In this session, we'll explore common misconceptions about eating and weight concerns and how the media may play a role. We'll also discuss how these unhealthy thoughts and behaviors can lead to eating disorders such as anorexia, bulimia, and binge eating disorder for both men and women.
