


Visit our campus

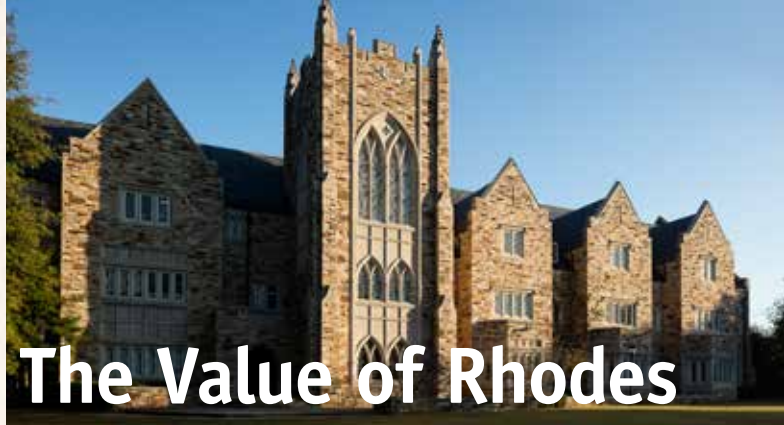
MEN'S AND WOMEN'S NCAA DIVISION III INTERCOLLEGIATE TEAMS

The Value of Rhodes

The financial aid and scholarship programs offered by Rhodes make it possible for qualified students from all walks of life to attend. Our merit-based and need-based financial aid packages level the higher education playing field, and it is not uncommon for the actual out-of-pocket expense of attending Rhodes to be no greater than that of attending a large state university.

The Rhodes College Net Price Calculator can assist you in estimating an Expected Family Contribution and in understanding all the types of financial aid that might be available to you. The result will provide you with an estimated award package like one you might receive after you have applied for admission and been accepted at Rhodes. Admission and Financial Aid Deadlines

Rhodes practices holistic admission, meaning that our evaluation reviews each student's high school transcript, SAT or ACT scores, a written essay, extracurricular activities, and school and teacher recommendations.

The Common Application also serves as the application for Rhodes' merit-based competitive scholarships.

• Early Decision (ED) applicants make a commitment to Rhodes as their first-choice institution and agree that, if admitted, they will enroll and withdraw all other applications assuming an adequate financial aid package is provided. Rhodes begins review of ED I applications on Sept. 1 and ED II applications on Nov. 15. Notifications of ED acceptance status are normally sent out within two weeks of reception of all supporting documents.

• Early Action (EA) applicants receive notification of their admission decision and eligibility for financial aid/scholarships by January 15. No binding commitment to attend Rhodes is required for EA consideration.

FAFSA and CSS PROFILE Deadlines

Timely submission of the FAFSA and CSS PROFILE is necessary in order to qualify for need-based aid programs.
