I spent my summer interning in Barcelona at Peace Dividend Initiative (PDI), a Swiss NGO whose mission is to turn peace into a

tangible, shared economic benefit for people living in conflict-affected regions. I worked closely with the incubation team, and by the midpoint of my internship, they trusted me to build out my own project. I chose to focus on the Central African Republic, drawn to the untapped potential in the production of shea nut butter. I felt this was a promising opportunity to combine both economic development and peacebuilding.

Over the following weeks, I developed a detailed budget, outlined a peacebuilding business model, and prepared concept notes to present before donors. I also conducted research on market entry strategies for shea butter in Europe and assessed alignment with funders like Cartier Philanthropy. Additionally, I drafted several funding proposals for grants, which have become significantly more competitive in the wake of cuts to

Outside the office, I found myself learning just as much. Barcelona revealed itself pieceby piece. Locals taught me to cook the Catalan way — simmered, not rushed. Weekends stretched outward. Sometimes I traveled with new friends, sometimes alone. I went to Tarragona and stumbled upon a street festival where a brass band adopted me for the evening and invited me to a fireworks show on the beach.

One weekend I made a deliberate trip to Madrid. I wanted to stand in front of Guernica, I had seen photos, studied the brushwork from afar, but nothing prepared me for the scale of it — or the silence it commanded.

This wasn't some résumé-polishing summer abroad. It was long hours. rewrites, humid bus commutes, and moments of real, earned clarity. It was a summer of learning what it means to try something hard, in a place that stirs your imagination. Thanks to Rhodes, I got to experience the ineffable magic that floats through the summer air in Barcelona.

#### Theodore William Eckels International Business Internship:

These internships are awarded annually to outstanding sophomore or junior students with a 3.2+ GPA (overall and major) and a declared major in either the Department of Business or Economics. This award allows students to work abroad for eight weeks during the summer. The internship will cover the cost of airfare and accommodations while living abroad. This is a merit-based scholarship named in honor of business leader Theodore William Eckels to advance the Rhodes Vision to graduate students with a passion for lifelong learning, compassion for others, and the ability to translate academic study and personal concern into effective leadership and action in their communities around the world.

#### **Morelle Legg International Internship for Women:**

The Morelle Legg International Internship is awarded to an outstanding student in either the Department of Economics or Business to allow them to obtain work experience in a foreign country during the summer following their junior year. A 3.2+ GPA (overall and in the major) is required. The scholarship covers the cost of an eight week internship including costs related to travel to and from the host country, housing, meals, and incidentals. This is a merit-based scholarship funded by an anonymous donor.

#### **Wasfy Iskander International Internship:**

This scholarship is awarded to an outstanding sophomore or junior with a major in the Department of Economics. A 3.2+ GPA (overall and in the major) is required. The purpose of the Wasfy Iskander International Internship is to allow the recipient to obtain work experience in a foreign country for six to eight weeks during the summer. The scholarship pertains to costs associated with commuting to and from the host country, housing, meals, and incidentals. This is a merit-based scholarship named in honor of Economics Professor Wasfy Iskander who taught at Rhodes College from 1969-2002.
