

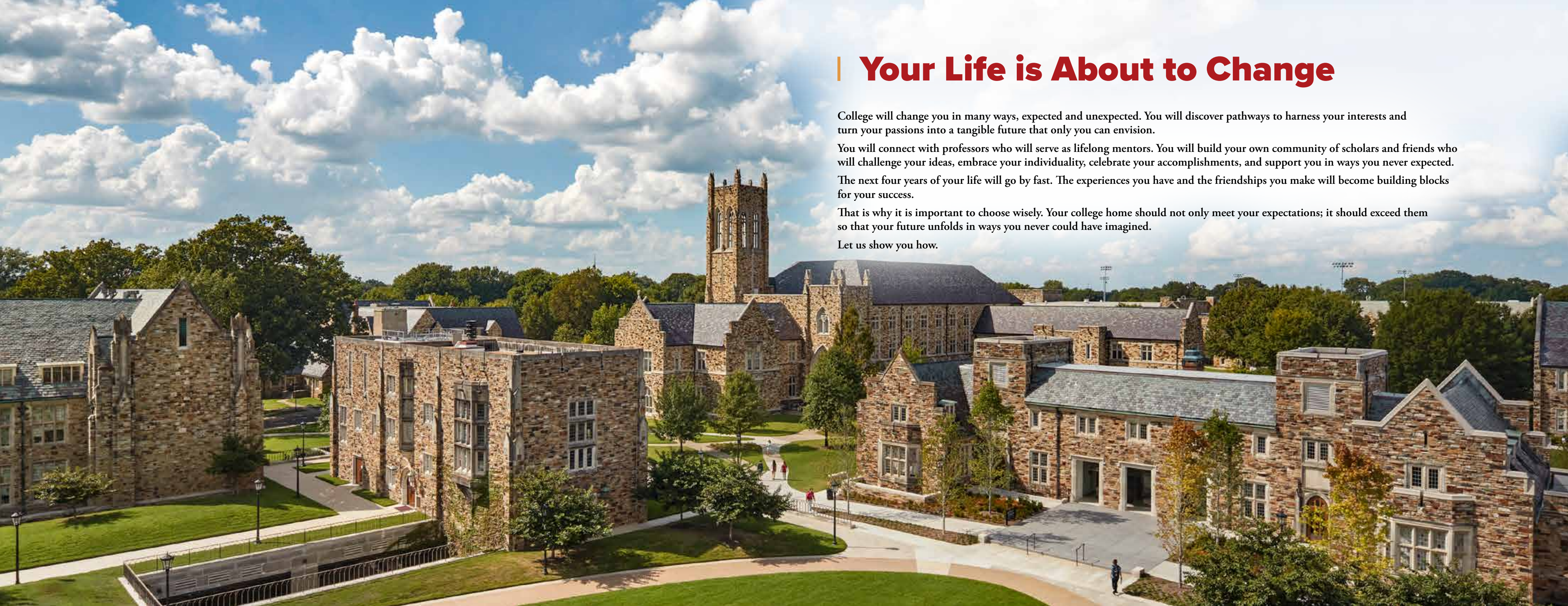

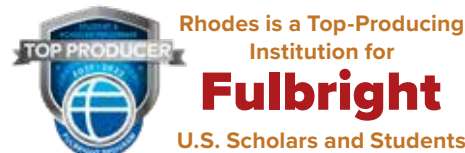

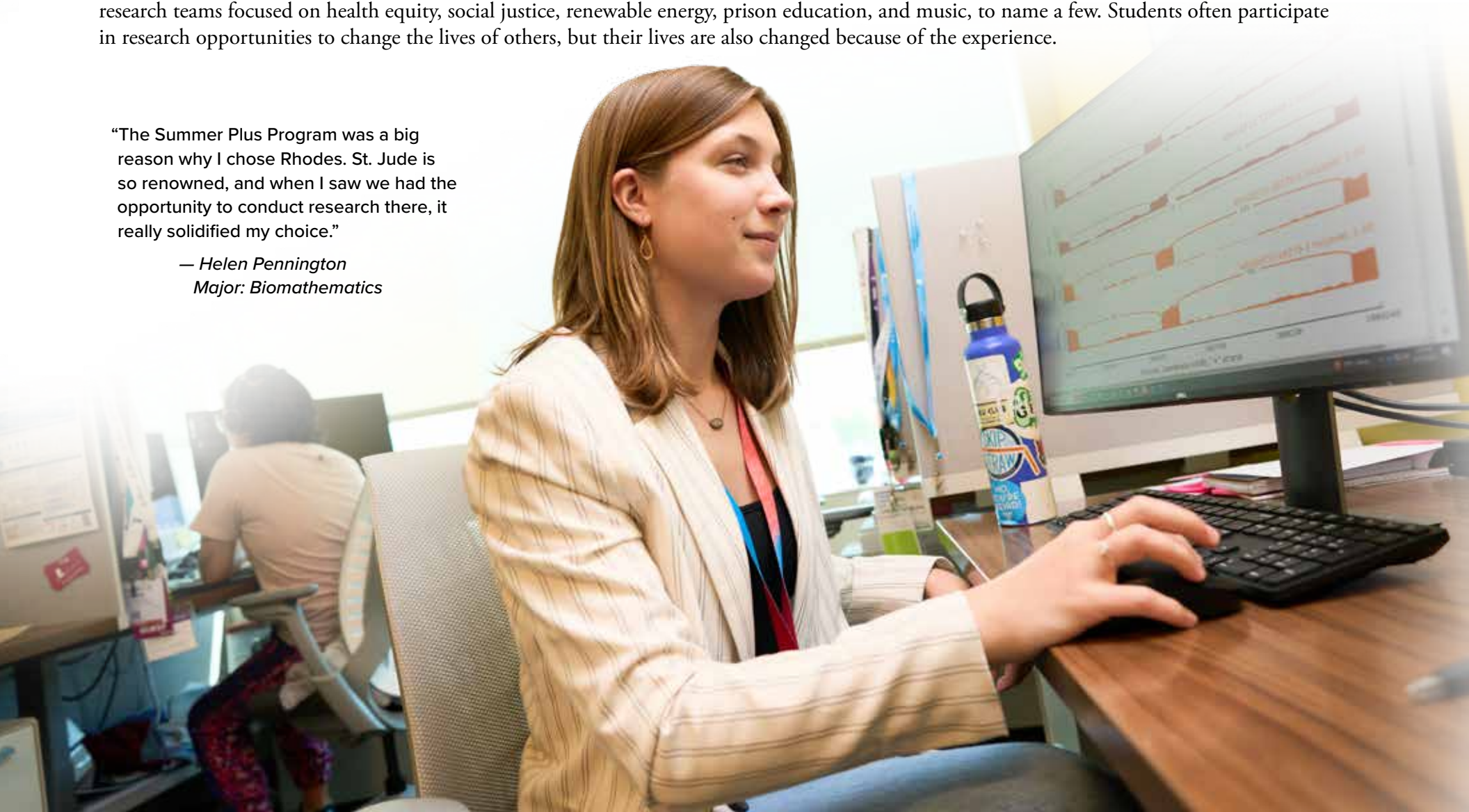


A Place for Life-Changing Research

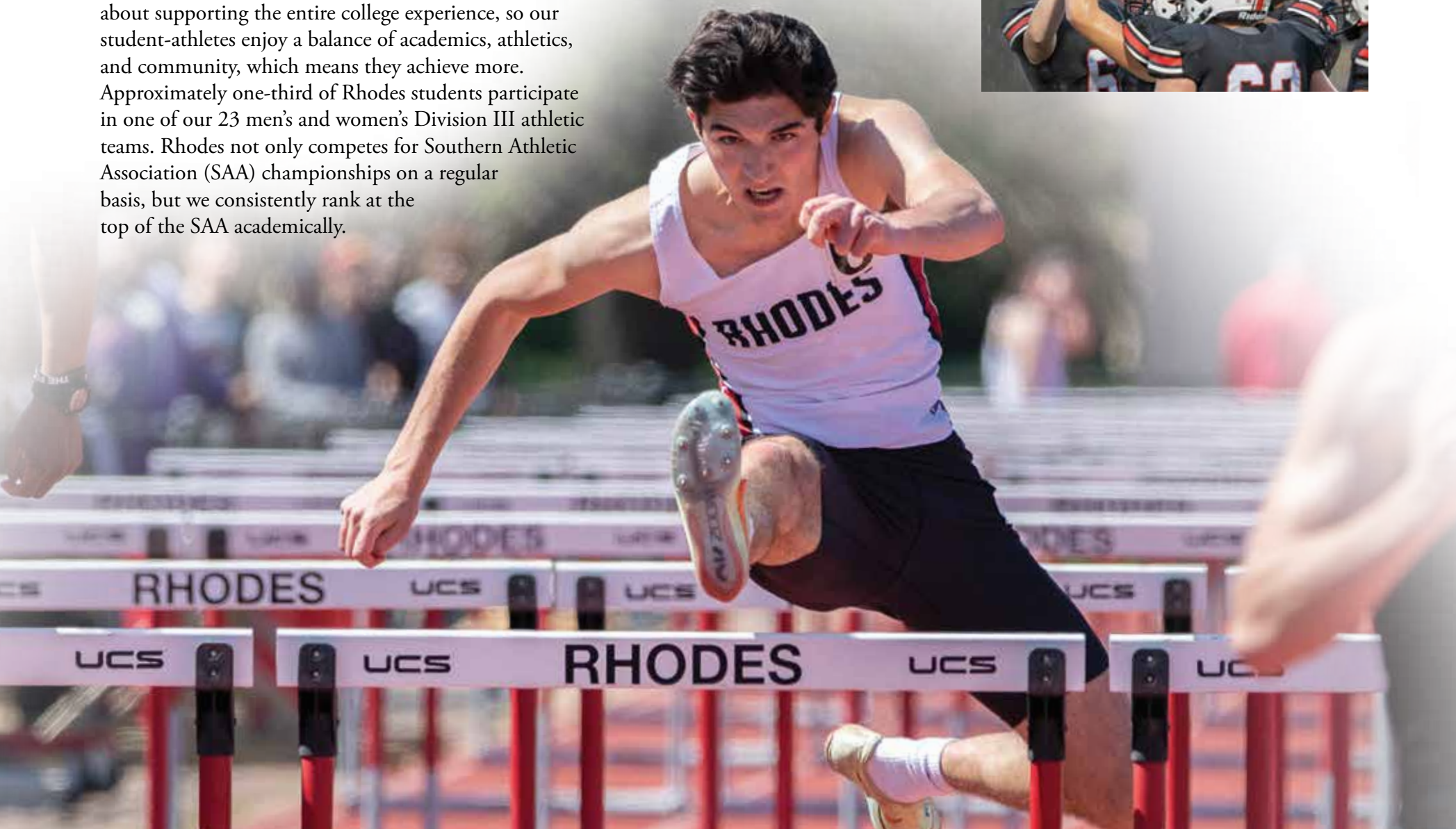


We have an uncommon next-door neighbor—the Memphis Zoo—which also happens to be one of our most longstanding partners and one of the best zoos in the nation.

For over a decade, the biology department's animal behavior class has designed and executed research projects in collaboration with the Memphis Zoo. This experience gives Rhodes students the opportunity to go deeper than a textbook or lecture—they make discoveries that shape our understanding of animals and nature.

A Place for Champions

Rhodes has a championship culture. It is not just about winning titles – although we do plenty of that. It is also about supporting the entire college experience, so our student-athletes enjoy a balance of academics, athletics, and community, which means they achieve more. Approximately one-third of Rhodes students participate in one of our 23 men's and women's Division III athletic teams. Rhodes not only competes for Southern Athletic Association (SAA) championships on a regular basis, but we consistently rank at the top of the SAA academically.

A Place to Call Home

You will likely spend a considerable amount of time enjoying the various options our city has to offer. Memphis is known for many things, especially its robust music scene and delicious food. Hint: we are known for our world-famous barbecue (we like ours wet, thank you).

Our museums include the National Civil Rights Museum, the Memphis Brooks Museum of Art, the Memphis Rock ‘n’ Soul Museum, and the Memphis Museum of Science and History.

Live music can be found around the city most nights. After all, this is where Elvis became a musical and cultural icon. Our city is the “Birthplace of Rock ‘n’ Roll” and the “Home of the Blues,” so a visit to Graceland and Beale Street is a must. Making Rhodes Affordable

We make it possible for qualified students from all walks of life to attend Rhodes. With our merit-based and need-based financial aid packages, it is not uncommon for the actual out-of-pocket expense of attending Rhodes to be competitive with the cost of attending a large state university.



Admission and Financial Aid

Rhodes practices holistic admission, meaning that our evaluation reviews each student's high school record, test scores (if submitted), written essay, extracurricular activities, and school and teacher recommendations.

Use the Common Application to apply. No application fee required.

Complete the FAFSA (CSS Profile also accepted) to maximise your need-based financial aid award. You can get started at fafsa.gov

*Early Decision (ED) applicants make a commitment to Rhodes as their first-choice institution and agree that, if admitted, they will enroll and withdraw all other applications assuming an adequate financial aid package is provided. Rhodes begins review of ED I applications on Sept. 1 and ED II applications on Nov. 15. Notifications of ED admission decisions are normally sent out twice a month.

**Early Action (EA) applicants receive notification of their admission decision and eligibility for financial aid/scholarships by January 15. No binding commitment to attend Rhodes is required for EA consideration.



Rhodes Merit Scholarships

Merit awards serve to recognize individual students for their academic talent, service, or leadership achievements. These competitive awards are determined on an individual basis and celebrate the strength and achievements of each admitted student, in and out of the classroom.

Rhodes has a priority deadline of December 1 for merit-based scholarships.

Regardless of application plan (Early Decision I, Early Decision II, Early Action, Regular Decision), applications received by the Office of Admission on or prior to December 1 will be considered for the following merit awards.*

- **Cambridge Scholarship: \$43,000** per year
- **Founders Scholarship: \$38,000** per year
- **Presidential Scholarship: \$37,000** per year
- **Ralph C. Hon Scholarship: \$35,000** per year
- **Diehl Scholarship: \$34,000** per year
- **Tennessee Advantage Scholarship: \$31,000** per year
- **Rhodes Award Scholarship: \$20,000 - \$32,000** per year

*Applications received after December 1 may still be considered for other merit awards as well as a limited number of the scholarships listed above.
